Last week's 2022 Academy Awards, "the slap seen around the world" and an historic best picture win for CODA, with its predominantly deaf cast, more than tripled **Movies** engagement. Unique users also grew by more than double week on week. Oscars fashion and red carpet radiance boosted **Pop Culture** PVs, up +31%, driven by a +71% growth in engagement with **Celebrity Style** content.

Elsewhere, the start of the school holidays saw Brits continue to plan out their family time off. This furthered growing interest in our **Special Occasions** (+64%) and **Home & Garden** (+14%) content, with **Interior Decorating** (+115%) and **Personal Celebrations** (+26%) key topics drivers. And interest in Prince Philip's memorial service at Westminster Abbey also boosted engagement with the **Religious Events** topic, up +98% week on week.

Finally, the draw for the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 grew engagement with our **Sporting Events** topic by **+42%** week on week as football fans nationwide dared to dream of World Cup glory. Source: The Ozone Project 2022


