OZONE OVERVIEW

With the school half term and Valentine's Day both taking place this week, it's no surprise that our **Family & Relationships** content topped our Top 10 table in the last seven days. Almost 40m page views increased by +17% week on week, with a +79% rise for the **Dating** topic a key driver. There was related growth for our **Travel** and **Food & Drink** categories, which also feature in our Top 10. Topics including **Travelling with Kids** and **Dining Out** were among the key drivers with page views increasing by +81% and +62% respectively.

There was also related growth for three of our other top-10 content categories last week with reader interest in the Grammy's and the BRITS high. **Style & Fashion** (Sam Smith stole two red carpets in a week), **Pop Culture** (Ben Affleck's Grammy's 'misery' became a meme) and **Music & Audio** (the first gender neutral BRITS massively missed the representation mark) all enjoyed weekly page views highs for 2023.

Finally, the devastating Turkey-Syria earthquake dominated the hard news agenda last week and put related **News & Politics** content about the disaster into focus for millions of concerned Brits.

The BRIT Awards – typically the first major celebration of UK music in the industry's annual calendar – took place last week.


Taking place on a Saturday night for the first time in its 47-year history, interest in the BRITS was higher than previous years as it was the first to feature gender neutral prizes.

Winning big on the night were Harry Styles and Wet Leg while Sam Smith made headlines for their attention grabbing red carpet outfit.

TAKE ACTION

Engagement with our Music & Audio content grows around the biggest events. Last year, the weeks in which the BRITS, Eurovision, the Platinum Jubilee concert, Glastonbury, Reading & Leeds and the Christmas number one took place saw +30% more page views than the 2022 weekly average.

+34% BRITS avg. Music & Audio PVs growth

From awards show build up to what the winners said on the night, content about the BRITS grows interest in our **Music & Audio** category. On average, engagement increases by more than a third in the week of the BRITS (or 3.4m more page views than normal).

+209% Contemporary/ Pop/Top 40 topic PVs growth

The **Contemporary/Pop/Top 40** topic within our **Music & Audio** content was a key driver of category interest. Almost 5m weekly page views for the topic more than tripled. On average engagement with the topic increases by more than 2.5 times in BRITS week.


